Mary full of WISDOM

The one who was wise enough to tell the waiters at the Wedding Feast at Cana – “Do whatever he tells you”. May we always listen to Jesus and do whatever he tells us.

Mary the CHOSEN one

The one, invited by God to be the mother of Jesus; the chosen one who, despite her fears, confusion and anxieties, said “Yes” to God. May our response to God always be “Let it be done to me according to your word”.

Mary the PEACEFUL woman

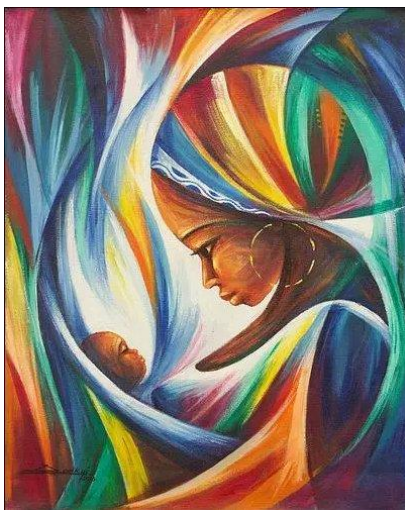
