Dear all

As we come to the end of our Christmas Season and we move into ordinary time I wish you all a very Blessed New Year and hope for happier times for us all. As I write this message to you we have a degree of speculation as to whether we can keep the churches open. The Bishops want us to stay open but a growing number of you are beginning to feel it is not safe. Thank you for your responses it really helps. I am particularly grateful to all who have been stewards. Your commitment and dedication to the welcome and cleaning of our church has been amazing. I am very touch by those of you who have contributed to the cleaning materials. We have had a number of sad deaths in the parish these last few weeks, please keep their families in your prayers.

I have spoken to a number of people in the community who are concerned about the vaccine and do not want the injection. This has worried me as we have a number of groups in this community who are more vulnerable than others. Please think of the consequences of not having the vaccine. I received the vaccine yesterday as I am seen as a frontline worker. I was very impressed with the way it was done and apart from a little discomfort today in my arm I am fine. I do encourage you all to have the Vaccine. Please do check the website for any developments.

WEEKLY/MONTHLY OFFERINGS

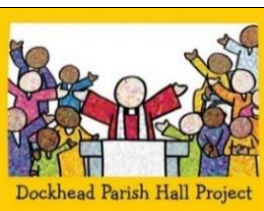
