Dear all

Holy week begins and this year we can come together and share this most special time for the Christian family. When I look back all I can remember was the shock that as a community we could not be together. I remember the podcasts that so many of you were involved in linking us together for Holy Week. They brought great comfort to so many. They are still available to see.

This year we can come together but for safety sake we have extended the service times to avoid overcrowding.

Please take note of the service times for the Triduum. The times this year are very different. Attendance for all the services has been very good in the past so to keep us all safe we are extending the service time for Maundy Thursday 6pm-9pm and Good Friday. 12noon to 4pm. This way I hope that you can come to share these special moments in your own time. On Thursday and on Friday the Gospels will be repeated on the hour and on Thursday the parish Act of dedication on the half hour and Friday the prayers of intercessions on the half hour.

This weekend our Hosannas may feel very different but every time I hear some one say I have had my injection it feels like an Hosanna moment. Let's do our very best to see that the life we have at the moment is linked to the life of the Lord who shows us the way. As we enter this Holy Week let us be reassured that things are getting better and that the joy of spring shows us the recreational power of God. Christ is our Light as we wait to shout out the A word. Easter is days away and the cross this year has been very heavy but vaccine joy gives us great hope.

There are white Easter envelopes at the back of the church available for non-tax payers to use if you wish.

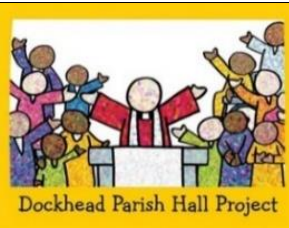
