First Reconciliation and Communion 2021

Now that lockdown is easing, we are beginning to be able to re-start our Sacramental Programme.

Information leaflets are at the back of the church for parents with children in Year 3 and above. If you feel that this is the right time for your child, please take a leaflet from the back of the church and contact Canon Alan for an application form that needs to be **returned by 2nd May 2021**.

When you attend Mass please do not mingle with anyone outside of your household or support bubble. No one showing symptoms of COVID-19 should attempt to attend Mass.

All members of the congregation must:

- *Wear a face covering; this is now law*
- *Sanitize their hands upon entry and leaving*
- *Adhere to social distancing guidelines - we ask that you do not kneel & follow Steward directions for receiving Communion*
- *Either use the NHS app & QR code to check in or give your contact details to some of the stewards so that you can be contacted if needed by the NHS Test and Trace.*

OFFERINGS

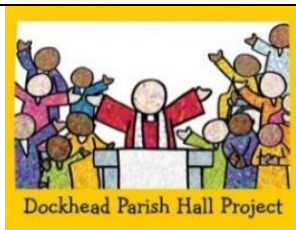
