Are you considering getting married in 2022 either in the Parish or somewhere else?

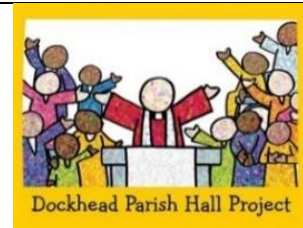

Memorial Paving Stones

As part of the new entrance to our church and Parish Centre we will form a new piazza. This will be made up of Memorial Paving Stones. Each paving stone will have the name of a deceased member of the parish or of a member of your family who has died. This idea is common in some churches or in the grounds around the building. The project will help support the Parish Centre Project and will be a permanent reminder of those who have died. I also think it will look very beautiful as people come to enter the church.

The cost will be £1000.

No one is expected to pay at this time and we can also work out a way for people to pay in instalments.

If you are interested please fill in the interest form that you will find in the church and then pop the form through the Priest's House door.

When you attend Mass we ask you to be considerate of others. We request that all members of the congregation:

- *Sanitize their hands upon entry and leaving*
- *Wear a face covering*
- *Adhere to social distancing guidelines - we ask that you do not kneel & follow Steward directions for receiving Communion*

No one showing symptoms of COVID-19 should attempt to attend Mass.
